




Population and Land Area in Health Shortage Areas















Average Number of Full-Time Rural and Urban Hospital Employees, 2017 to 2022



Rural and Urban Average Hospital Profit Margin, FY2015 to FY2022




% Financially Vulnerable Rural Hospitals by State, 2022


Medicare/Medicaid Dependent Population, 2022



- At or Below the Statewide Rate
- Above Statewide Rate
- 32% of rural and 30% of urban Pennsylvanians are completely or partially dependent on Medicaid and/or Medicare for their health insurance
- Typically, both Medicaid and Medicare have lower reimbursement rates than commercial insurers.
- dependent on Medicaid/Medicare payments Lower reimbursement rates may cause some providers to avoid areas that are more




Counties Where Health Care is the Biggest Employer, 3rd Quarter, 2023
