





#### **Dual Enrollment/Advanced Placement: \$1,115,420**

Dual Enrollment courses offer high school students the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school by taking courses in their high school classroom, on the college campus or using distance learning technology. Advanced Placement offers instruction/programming that provides credits or advanced placement at a two or four year college or university. Eligible expenses include books, materials, tuition and fees.

1,060 Students Served

In 2023, funding supported the Afterschool and Competition Program and Technology & the Arts. A total of 60 students participated in Skills USA through the Afterschool and Competition Program funding, and 1,000 students benefited from equipment purchased for the Graphic Arts and Production Technology program. Increased funding provided in 2024 expands these programs to include STEAM Camp for students in grades five through eight to explore a variety of careers through hands on activities. In addition, funding provided in 2024 supports the Workplace Career Exploration program that will offer students the opportunity to work in a co-op or internship program.



#### PENNSYLVANIA ASSOCIATION OF RURAL AND SMALL SCHOOLS

In 2023, grant funding in the amount of \$25,000 provided programs for over 3,000 students in rural schools throughout Pennsylvania. In 2024, there were 152 grant requests submitted representing over \$600,000 in funding, and 22 requests were awarded.



#### COTERRA ENERGY 2024 NEIGHBORHOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) is administered by the Department of Community & Economic Development. Funds provide programs to support low income populations.



#### PARKWAY WEST CAREER & TECHNOLOGY CENTER

#### \$133,333.33

Funding provided in 2024 supported the construction of eight new welding lab areas, providing space for an additional 16 students. Adult students will learn a variety of welds and will be eligible to earn accreditation and certification through the American Welding Society.



#### SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY CAREER & TECHNOLOGY CENTER

#### \$490,500

NAP funding provided in 2024 supported low-income adult students seeking to earn a certification in CDL, cosmetology and culinary arts. Funds supported additional lighting in the CDL training area to allow for evening classes. In addition, funding supported updates to the cosmetology and culinary arts areas of the school to accommodate additional students and provide the most current tools and equipment, therefore preparing students for entrance into their new careers. To date, a total of 89 adult students participated in the programs as a result of the grant.



## NAP APPROVALS FOR 2025 GRANTING



#### NEPA COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE

#### \$60,000

Funding will support the hiring of a Licensed Professional Counselor to help ease the wait time for low income individuals to receive mental health care.



#### PARKWAY WEST CAREER & TECHNOLOGY CENTER

#### \$500,000

Funding will support the construction and addition of an outdoor welding lab for adult students.



#### SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY CAREER & TECHNOLOGY CENTER

#### \$1,494,625

Funding will support construction costs, upgrades and scholarships for adult students earning certificates in CDL, Diesel Technology, LPN and Welding.

#### SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY RECREATION CENTER

#### \$1,333,333.33

Funding will support initial construction of a brand new recreation center in Susquehanna County.



#### **TREHAB**

#### \$150,000

Funding will support the purchase of a home in Montrose, PA for a low income family facing foreclosure. In addition, low income families will receive education and support to assist them with home ownership.





The Coterra Energy Foundation was established to support non-profit organizations and educational programs in Coterra Energy's footprint. In 2024 there were 35 requests made for grants and 26 grants were awarded.
